

The Tobacco Products Directive 2014/40/EU (TPD) requires manufacturers and importers of electronic cigarettes and refill containers to submit key information on their products to the competent authorities of Member States in which they intend to place these products on the market. The reporting and notification obligations follow from Article 20 of the TPD.

The specific rules on common electronic formats have been established by **Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2015/2183** of 24 November 2015 establishing a common format for the notification of electronic cigarettes and refill containers.

The Tobacco, Tobacco Products and Related Products Control Law (Law) implements the TPD in Lithuania.

Article 2 of the Law defines that:

- ‘**Electronic cigarette**’ – product that can be used for consumption of nicotine-containing vapour via a mouth piece, or any component of that product, including a cartridge, a tank and the device without cartridge or tank. Electronic cigarettes can be disposable or refillable by means of a refill container and a tank, or rechargeable with single use cartridges;
- ‘**Refill container**’ – a receptacle that contains a nicotine-containing liquid, which can be used to refill an electronic cigarette.

In accordance with Article 9³ of the Law notifications on the products which are intended to be placed on the Lithuanian market have to be submitted by the manufactures and importers of electronic cigarettes and refill containers using the EU Common electronic entry gate **EU-CEG**. The information should be submitted six months prior to the first placement on the market of each brand and each type of the product. A new notification shall be submitted for each substantial modification of the product.

The order No T1-144 of the Director of the Drug, Tobacco and Alcohol Control Department sets out that the annual data referred to in Article 20(7) of the TPD should be submitted through the EU common entry gate EU-CEG until the 1st July of the next year.

There are no fees for receiving, storing, handling, analysing and publishing the submitted information.
